Nazarene Medical Missionary Union

The Nazarene Medical Missionary Union was formed by C. J. Kinne for the express purpose of building Bresee Memorial Hospital in China. Kinne had rendered distinguished service to the church as manager of the Nazarene Publishing Company of Los Angeles and first manager of the Nazarene Publishing House in Kansas City. After his first wife's death, Kinne married Sue Bresee, daughter of Phineas Bresee.

Bethany Home Sanatorium, Phoenix, Arizona

The Bethany Home Sanatorium appears to have been a short-lived institution which served either as a Christian home for the sick or a home for "returned soldiers" or both. The First Arizona District Assembly in 1921 voted to hold the sanatorium property as "Church property in trust," elected a board of five trustees, and made plans to have the home promoted by its superintendent, who was to visit the various district assemblies across the United States. As recorded in the Second Arizona District Assembly minutes, the home's manager, Rev. Q. A. Deck, was granted a transfer to the Nebraska district, and the Arizona district was freed from further responsibility for the Bethany Home, as District Superintendent H. C. Cagle had given permission to sell the property.
