B. INSTRUCTIONS TO STUDENTS

If you sense a call from God to full-time clergy ministry, here are some guidelines to help you get started. Some of the steps will be completed concurrently while others will be done sequentially.

First: speak with your pastor about your call. If you do not have a pastor at this time, contact the District Superintendent.

Second: become involved in a ministry that reaches people. If you are not already ministering ask the leaders of your congregation for ministry as a Sunday School teacher or small group leader. This kind of ministry provides you with an overview of the work of pastoring. All ministry begins with lay ministry.

Third: ask your pastor to involve you with the *Sourcebook* and the ministry development plan in it. The *Sourcebook* is available online at www.nazarene.ca.

Fourth: within the year, request a Local Minister's license from the church board.

Fifth: make application through your pastor to be involved in the District Ministerial Assessment Center.

Sixth: Upon receiving a positive response from your Local Minister's License and the District Ministerial Assessment Center, make plans to complete the course of study for clergy preparation. You can complete the course of study several ways. Your pastor will advise you as to the best way for you. Here are some options:

1. If you are graduating from high school or under 25 years old, unmarried or married without a family, enroll at Ambrose/CNC or another Nazarene liberal arts college or university. After completing a BA level degree, enroll in Nazarene Theological Seminary and complete the course of study there. This is known as the "normative route" of ministerial study. Complete the first four steps of the above plan before enrolling at Ambrose/CNC.
2. If you are older, i.e. above twenty-five, and/or married with a family, or for some other reason unable to re-locate to a college/university, you may complete the course of

study through online or district study programs. Some courses must be taken by a validated course of study provider. Others must be taken through a Wesleyan Armenian provider.

3. The district study program may be completed through district Ministry Development Centers. The course of study will be taught in evening and/or weekend sessions close to home or through pods. You can stay involved with your job and not disrupt your family while completing the course of study and gaining ministry experience. Please note: this option is **not** advocated for those who are described in option one. It is mainly for second career ministers and best for those who already have a BA equivalent degree.
4. Stay actively involved in ministry as you complete your educational requirements.

Eligibility

The board serves only the persons who are properly enrolled. Enrollment is open only to local ministers, local lay ministers (Manual 408.1), and ministers of music who qualify according to Manual 410.

Courses

There are two ministerial courses administered by the Ministerial Studies Board: elder and deacon.

Ministers will not be ordained without having completed their respective courses.

The courses required of the college students are in Manual 426.1.

College Students

College students are responsible to submit to the board documentary evidence of academic standing in harmony with Manual 426.1.

College students are reminded to plan their curriculum in harmony with Manual 426.1. The final transcript at graduation will be evaluated by the District Ministerial Studies Board, and no requirements stated in the Manual will be waived.

IV. Daily Proceedings

Thursday, June 16, 2011

Afternoon Session

The 63rd District Assembly began with a word of greeting and prayer from DS, Dr. Larry Dahl. Mike Shuster and Nicole Johnson led in a time of worship. Rev. Bob Tattrie, District Secretary, greeted the assembly and invited Dr. Dahl to lead the reports to be presented for the afternoon. He welcomed General Superintendent, Dr. Jerry Porter, to the assembly and then invited Rev. Audrey Dahl, Director of Canadian Domestic Compassionate Ministries Centers. She shared about the 7 of the 10 compassionate ministries centers across Canada and then invited Floyd Perras (Siloam Mission, Winnipeg, MB), Bernice McNair (Prince Albert, SK) and Doug Sedore (Building Hope, Edmonton, AB) to bring reports on behalf of those ministries. This was followed by a General Church video presentation connecting compassionate ministries with making Christlike disciples for the nations.

Dr. Dahl introduced those who minister for the Church in various Chaplaincy ministries including: Dr. Debbie Tanasieuk, Regional Chaplain, Correctional Services Canada; Rev. Steve Conklin chaplain at the provincial correctional centre in Fort Saskatchewan, AB; Rev. Bud Sargent who will begin providing interim Chaplaincy services at Bowden Institution, a federal prison near Innisfail, AB; and Rev. Ken Austin who serves as chaplain for the Red Deer Regional Health Centre and as chaplain lead for other central Alberta health regions.

Ordained elders who work in education ministries were acknowledged including Rev. Kim Follis (University of Calgary), Dr. Don Quantz (Ambrose), and Dr. Riley Coulter (Ambrose) followed by Dr. Rob Snow's verbal report on his ministry as professor at Ambrose University College.

Another General Church compassionate ministries video clip was the lead in for Dr. Bill Stewart who gave a short presentation on 3 books available through the Canadian national office focusing on the history of the Church of the Nazarene in Canada (Love Does That), the theology of the Church of the Nazarene (Journey Into Holiness) and on prayer (Journey Into Prayer).

Those who serve in connectional ministries presented were mentioned and reports were given by Rev. Rose Brower-Young (Kidztown), and Rev. Reg Graves (Canadian Bible Society).

Presentations about innovative church ministries were given by Rev. David Kenny (Northside Community Church, Medicine Hat, AB); Maxine Ingles (Hecla Community Church, Hecla Island, MB); Menno Friesen (Riverton, MB); and Rev Bryan Roller (Sudanese Church, Calgary, AB) who introduced Pastor Moses and Boor who are leaders in the church. Pastor Moses brought greetings.

The following pastor's reports were presented: Rev. Steve Conklin (Fort Saskatchewan, AB); Rev. Alfredo Velasco (Manitoba Mission area and River of Life Church of the Nazarene,

Winnipeg, MB); Pastor Tim Enns (New Hope, Winnipeg, MB); Rev. Gregg Rustulka (Saskatchewan Mission Area and Prince Albert, and on behalf of Saskatoon Louise Street Community Church); Pastor Randy Clark (Regina Prairie View); Pastor Randall Neufeld (Wapella); Pastor David Bayduza (Yorkton); Rev. Dale Hansen (Rocky Mountain House, AB); Rev. Doug Webb (Peace River Mission Area and North Country Community Church, Grande Prairie, AB); Rev. The assembly was adjourned until the evening session.

Thursday, June 16, 2011

Evening Session

Rev. Bob Tattrie welcomed everyone to this 63rd District Assembly and invited everyone to worship through the music ministry of Mike Shuster of Calgary. Dr. Glenn Follis offered a prayer of thanksgiving and blessing.

Rev. Bob Tattrie welcomed these Church leaders to the assembly: Dr. Jerry Porter (General Superintendent), Dr. Claire MacMillan (Director, Church Of The Nazarene Canada), Dr. William (Rita) Stewart (retired Canadian National Director, Dr. Riley Coulter (President of Canadian Nazarene College and Chancellor, Ambrose University College, Dr. Larry (Audrey) Dahl (Canada West District Superintendent), and Rose Graham (Canada West District Business Administrator).

Dr. Porter brought greetings and made opening comments celebrating God's grace in all of our lives. He presented Dr. Dahl to the assembly and invited Dr. Dahl to bring his 4th report and then to preach to the assembly.

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Dr. Dahl began with thanking those who work alongside him in ministry and then drew the assembly to several sections of his report including Evaluating Ministry Effectiveness and gave recognition to pastors and churches who demonstrated great growth: Calgary First Church (Rev. Bryan Roller), Claresholm (Rev. Eddie Rossiter), Grande Prairie (Rev. Doug Webb), Innisfail (Rev. Bud Sargent) and Red Deer First (Rev. Kyle Mills). Honourable mention for churches achieving stability and growth in all but one of the growth areas: Calgary Skyview (Rev. Stuart Williams), Drumheller (Rev. Glenn Reeder), Lacombe (Rev. Bob Tattrie), Medicine Hat Glenview (Dr. David Skidmore), Prince Albert (Rev. Gregg Rustulka), Rocky Mountain House (Rev. Dale Hansen), Sylvan Lake (Pastor Barry Sigurdson), Winnipeg River of Life (Rev. Alfredo Velasco) and Yorkton (Rev. David Bayduza).

Lesley Anne MacCormack spoke about scholarships for Nazarene students at Ambrose University College. Rose Brower-Young is the new Nazarene Ambrose Liaison. She spoke about student involvement in local Nazarene churches and shared comments from Nazarene students who appreciated being involved in local churches.

Dr. Dahl then went on to speak about a dream and hope. He mentioned 3 things he felt seemed attainable this year, the first being a strategy to reach the cities across the district. Strategies will vary from city to city and the development will depend on the pastors and church leaders who develop them. He introduced Dr. David Nicholas who shared about "Circle of Friends" a ministry that reaches out to those who are on the fringes of the community and our churches which is those with disabilities and their families. This ministry takes place out of Edmonton First Church. Dr. Dahl prayed over the ministry and then invited Glen McDowell of Edmonton Southside Church to share his missional story and his missional mission statement. He spoke about getting involved in his neighbourhood. He met people with real life issues and God opened up new doors of ministry. He dared us to be missional and to have a vision and allow the Holy Spirit to work in our lives. Dr. Porter prayed over Glen as he seeks to be the presence of Jesus in his neighbourhood.

The second attainable thing Dr. Dahl presented as attainable was for every Christian to be a missionary, every house to be seen as a church and every church as a training ground for missionaries. He invited Rev. Bryan Roller to share about how he and Calgary First Church are developing Life Transformation Groups.

The third initiative Dr. Dahl felt important has to do with youth and young adults. He wants to discern how the church can remain vital and relevant to the faith and life of young adults. He then invited Mike Shuster to lead us in a song. Dr. Dahl then preached on the theme "Shaped To Serve."

In response to the sermon Dr. Porter led us in an affirmation of "Wesley's Covenant Prayer." He then offered a prayer of benediction and the assembly was adjourned until the morning.

General Superintendent Dr. and Mrs. Jerry Porter; National Director Dr. Clair MacMillan; President of Canadian Nazarene College and Chancellor of Ambrose University College, Dr. and Mrs. Riley Coulter; President of Ambrose University College, Dr. and Mrs. Howard Wilson; delegates and friends, I welcome you to the sixty-third District Assembly of the Canada West District Church of the Nazarene. This is my 30th report to Canada West District as a minister in the Church of the Nazarene and my fourth as your District Superintendent.

I am honoured to have served as your District Superintendent for what will soon be five years. It continues to be a daunting assignment for me but, as always, is made so much richer and fulfilling by affording me the chance to work alongside so many amazing pastors and people.

While this may be my report to the Assembly, it is hardly the work of one person. I am deeply indebted to so many hard working and dedicated people. Just a few that I would like to recognize:

Audrey: my wife and partner in ministry. She carries several ministries of her own both in our local church and on the National Church level with Compassionate Ministries. With my travel schedule she endures a lot of time alone but accepts it as a part of the price she is willing to pay for this cause.

Rose Graham: our gifted and hard working Administrator. Last year, the DAB rewarded her 11 years of dedicated and sacrificial ministry by granting her a 3 month sabbatical. She came back stronger and better than ever. She has assembled a remarkable team to help with the mountain of details: Rose Brower-Young, until December when she took on a ministry assignment as the Interim for Calgary East; Ruthanne Williams who stepped in and now serves in a permanent assignment as the Administrative Assistant; and Jena Beagle is back providing valuable support during the hectic Assembly time.

Mr. Ken Walker: is a dedicated church-man and a highly efficient keeper of the books for the District. He also helps with investments as well as working with Marta Stevenson, our Investment Advisor from RBC. More important to me – Ken is easy to work with and patient with helping me to understand the intricacies of our finances.

Mr. Bill Parkins: has served for many years as our District treasurer – not only bringing to the role the skill of understanding finances but also integrity and trustworthiness.

Dr. David Skidmore: continues to define and shape the look of New Ministries for us on our District. He has introduced us to the Organic Church Network and is helping us to set up a coaching network for clergy and lay leaders alike.

District Advisory Board: these six elected individuals (Lay: Dawn Falk, Don Goings, Kelly Schwartz. Clergy: Dale Hansen, Jeff Baker, Doug Webb.) have truly lived up to the title as 'Advisors' and I have come to trust and depend on their wisdom, counsel and support. On average we have six meetings during the year: three face-to-face and three by conference call. Inevitably we are also calling on them for additional help by means of email votes or task groups.

District Board of Ministry: This is a critical group of ordained clergy who assist with interviewing, evaluating, and guiding those District licensed ministers who are preparing for Ordination in the Church of the Nazarene.

Rev. Bob Tattrie: has served for several years as our District Secretary in a very thorough way and always with distinction and appropriateness.

I. District Superintendent Assignment Report:

The Church Manual (Par. 206-214.1) provides a description of 35 activities assigned to the District Superintendent. The following is just a summary of my work in fulfilling this assignment on behalf of you, the people of Canada West District.

a) Clergy Placements:

- Yorkton:** David and Tammy Bayduza
- Grande Prairie:** Doug and Shelly Webb
- Winnipeg New Hope:** Tim and Lindsay Enns
- Calgary East:** Rose Brower-Young and Brad Young
- Edmonton First:** Dale and Arliss Fallon continue as the Interim Minister. An interview with a candidate is scheduled for the fall.

b) Processing of Clergy Ordination Certificates:

- Credentials Filed:** (Manual Par. 436) I have received for filing with the General Secretary the Ordination Certificates for Rev. James Clark. This Ordination Certificate will be kept by the General Secretary for safekeeping until re-entry into ministry within the Church.
- Credentials Removed:** Rev. Glenn and Shirley Hobden's credentials have been removed and their names dropped from the roll by uniting with another denomination
- Transfer of Credentials:** Roland Feltmate's credentials have been transferred, at his request, to the Christian Missionary Alliance where he serves in a Pastoral Care position with Foothills Alliance.

c) Pastoral Reviews:

I have worked with 8 pastors and boards in doing the Pastoral Reviews and all of them have been positive re-affirmations of pastoral leadership. All five of those who qualified for sabbaticals have been endorsed for sabbatical by their boards.

d) Clergy Health and Development:

There are several ways to evaluate pastoral health and development – here are a few indicators that we are seeing positive signs among clergy persons of personal and professional development:

- **Tenure:** It is encouraging to see the length of tenure for pastors has been growing longer over time.
 - **3** of our pastors have been in their churches for **20 year** or more. The longest serving pastor is Nolan Haring for **31** years at Sedgewick.
 - **6** pastors have been serving **10 years** or more!

Excluding the four churches that have been in transition this year, the average tenure for a pastor on Canada West District is **8.7 years**.

- **Sabbaticals:** We will have 11 pastors this year who have either taken a sabbatical or will be on one over the next few months; all of them will be on sabbatical for 3 or 4 months. That will mean that over the past 3 years over 20 pastors have benefited from this important act of support (Manual Par. 129.10).

It is to the credit of our church board leaders for understanding the health and wellness benefits that this provides our clergy leaders.

PALCON: This Pastor's Leadership training event occurs only rarely and is a cross-Canada event. It was hosted by Ambrose University at the end of August and 43 clergypersons from Canada West District were in attendance. It has received very positive responses from all those who attended.

- **Clergy Conference:** This is an annual function for clergy and is a highlight event for all of them. It is geared to provide an un-rushed atmosphere for building community and fellowship with each other. Because of the extra expense for PALCON this year, the decision was to forego the expense for a key note speaker – and just focus on saying “*Thanks*” to all those engaged in pastoral work. Rose Brower-Young orchestrated an event that included reading letters from **every** church on the District to their own pastor with a word of *Thanks*. It was a truly moving event.
- **Pastoral Prayer Retreats:** There are two prayer retreats held in early January. One for Alberta pastors and one for Saskatchewan and Manitoba pastors. There were a total of 30 pastoral leaders who participated this year. It has come to be an important time for contemplation and prayer at a mid-point time in the church year.

- **Pastoral Development:** This is an annual training event provided as a collaborated event between the Church of the Nazarene Canada; the USA/Canada Regional Office; and Ambrose University College. Riley Coulter and Terry Fach facilitate the event and this year it featured a full day presentation by Dr. Reginald Bibby, a well know Christian sociologist, who has spent the last several decades studying religious trends in Canada. 28 CWD pastors attended this challenging presentation.
- **Organic Church Network:** Dr. David Skidmore, in his role as the CWD New Ministry coordinator, made the arrangements, along with the Evangelism and New Church Development office of USA/Canada, presented a day long workshop on an innovative plan for Discipleship. 13 CWD pastors attended the one and a half day session with Darrel MacLearn of the Nazarene Organic Church Network.

Critical to all of the above means and ways of assisting clergy in matters of Health and Wellness is a caring and understanding core of lay leaders on church boards, and congregations who value the work of their pastors and pastoral team members.

Thank you for caring so much.

e) Church Presence:

One of the most enjoyable parts of my assignment is the opportunity I have to interact with individual churches, pastors and local leadership. I have been in contact with 31 of 35 churches and/or church leaders over the past year, some more than once. I have also been in touch with 4 New Ministries of 6 and all 6 of our Compassionate Centers throughout this year. I have enjoyed preaching 19 times. I have driven just over 65,000 km. this year. About half of my time (176 days by my count) is spent away from the Calgary office and on the road doing the work of Superintendence. You will find a full statistical report of my visits and meetings at the end of this report.

f) Auxiliary and Connectional Ministries:

We have been enriched with some excellent leaders for our three District Auxiliaries and I have enjoyed the opportunity to help out when and where I can.

NMI: Miar Davidson has provided strong and dedicated leadership for the past several years as the District NMI president. In a world that is growing both smaller and more complex at the same time, there is a need for people such as her who can help the local church remain clear on its focus to promote the work and ministry of Global Ministry. This is her final term and a new NMI President will be elected at this year's Convention. Thanks, Miar, for your determination in helping NMI move forward and continue highlighting the amazing work of Missions.

NYI: Ryan Wood will present a report on behalf of our District NYI ministry. I have attended the recent Legacy Youth Conference held here at Ambrose and was deeply

moved and greatly encouraged to see and hear and sense the dynamic of youth who have a strong desire to serve Christ in the world.

SDMI: I remain grateful for Tammy Herbert's gifted leadership for the educational arm of our church. Together with her council they have developed some truly novel and innovative ideas for advancing discipleship ministries within our churches. A busy mother, with duties and responsibilities, she has demonstrated a great heart for this work.

Camp Ministries: Camps are more than just a nice feature for us here on Canada West District, they are a huge benefit for spiritual growth and vitality and deeply entrenched in our historic roots as places where people came to make life-time decisions for Christ.

- **Harmattan Camp:** I have enjoyed the chance to be involved in several meetings with Camp Harmattan Association. They have had several changes take place over the past year. Dr. Glenn Follis has agreed to step into the role of Board Chairperson and has very quickly helped the board move forward on some important steps in organizational structure. Upon the resignation of the Executive Director, Larry Johnson, Basecamp Ministries (Wayne Smele and Matt Wilkes) accepted the challenge of guiding the camp through the next few years of operation and restructuring. I have appreciated having the chance to work closely with Basecamp on dreaming towards a new future for the camp. One step has been to move the organization and management of the Annual Family Camp event directly under Canada West District. I have been able to assemble a very talented and committed group of volunteers to assist with this.

- **Lakeshore Camp:** These are pivotal days for Lakeshore. It continues to be a very under-developed camping site with tremendous potential. I have appreciated the dedication and determination of a small core of leaders, led by the Camp board chairperson, Ed Restau and Camp secretary, Alfredo Velasco for doing all they can to see the camp move forward. You will hear, at Assembly, from Cam Mohan, a local church volunteer youth worker who knows the value this camp affords for the many kids he works with from disadvantaged homes in Winnipeg.

I encourage you to not only support these camps and their leaders in whatever way you can – but above all else pray for their leaders, volunteers, and the hundreds of campers who attend each year.

Ambrose University College: The more opportunity I have to mix with students and engage in conversation with the faculty and staff of Ambrose the more confident I am in recommending this as a school of excellence both spiritually and academically. You will see in the Administrator's report that our District now has three specific initiatives in place to enrich our connections between Ambrose students and the ministry of our church.

Ministry Development Centres: A part of our strategy for preparing men and women for clergy ministry has been the development of a system by which people can receive teaching and training in the 24 core courses for clergy preparation. While Ambrose continues to be the preferred educational provider for clergy preparation – ministry candidates can also obtain education on-line through NNU or NBC (and a significant number of them are enrolled in this). Additionally, Dr. David Skidmore and his team of workers in Medicine Hat, have developed an on-line video teaching resource which is being widely used across the District. Dr. Skidmore and Rev. Jerry Austin have been involved in teaching, and I have had the opportunity to recently complete the taping for the Living Ethical Lives module.

Joint Venture Support: Richard Bahan is a member of Calgary First Church and has been heavily involved with a number of Work and Witness projects to other world areas – most recently in Haiti. He shared with me a couple of years ago the idea of developing similar projects for churches here on Canada West District. His dream, however, was to do more than just a construction project, but to assist the church with outreach and ministry support as well. This would be a joint venture between the District, supportive congregations on the District, and the local church which would be the target of the help. Limitation with District funds over the past couple of years has meant we have been unable to provide the support, but we have, this year, allocated \$3,000 which has been matched by the District NMI, and have accepted the opportunity to work with the High Prairie Church of the Nazarene in helping them to prepare to provide compassionate outreach into their community.

Your churches, for the past two months, have been receiving bulletin inserts outlining the project and the need. You will hear more about this tomorrow afternoon from Richard himself.

In addition to some needed repairs to the parsonage, the construction team will do upgrades to the church kitchen to bring it up to a standard where it can be used for providing a ‘soup kitchen’ style of ministry to the more needy people of High Prairie. It is my hope that this project will become a model for ways by which the collective churches can partner together to help others achieve their goals. Thanks, Richard, for your vision on this.

I have been privileged, in my role as the DS, to participate with a number of other areas of our Church ministry, some of which are:

- National Board Church of the Nazarene Canada: annual meeting attendance
- The Administrator’s Fellowship Church of the Nazarene Canada: two meetings held each year
- Canadian Nazarene College: one meeting annually.

- I serve as the Canadian Representative for the Board of Governors for Nazarene Theological Seminary which meets twice a year in Kansas City, with extra meetings this year as we select a new President for the Seminary.

Church and Ministry Status: You have already heard the reports from some of our pastors earlier today and the remainder will report tomorrow. I believe you will be encouraged with these individual reports.

One method of evaluating the strength and effectiveness of ministry over the past year is to consider how this year compares to the past. You will find below a decadal progress chart for the District. The District Assembly Reports book contains a separate accounting for each church on the District.

a) Financial Realities:

This has been the first year for us to use the new Funding Formula developed by the General Church, so we have moved into new and uncharted territory. I am very grateful for those churches and local treasurers who have made a great effort to align with the new process and we are hopeful that it is making things a bit easier and perhaps even lightened the financial load. I have been pleased to hear from several churches that it has made it easier to do the calculations for the **Giving to Others** on a monthly basis – and a relief to not have to send cheques to Ambrose and all the auxiliaries. At the same time we are discovering some areas we are hoping to improve.

Because of the new Giving to Others funding formula that has been implemented this past year, we are not reporting the various IIM allocations in the combined report. We also depend upon each church to provide its own accounting on the 5.5% payment for **World Evangelism Fund** and 8.5% for the **Giving to Others**. There are four churches who have told us that they were not able to provide a full allocation of their **GTO** assignment however, **all of our churches have contributed something**. I am grateful for the effort made by every church to participate and the willingness of every church to do its share. **Thank you.**

As a District we are tremendously blessed to have had great guidance from the District Advisory Finance Committee. Rose Graham chairs that committee and has recognized the faithfulness of her team in her report.

The complete Treasurer’s report will be given tomorrow. I am very pleased to report that for the first time in several years we are showing a strong position in the black. It has come as a result of our churches faithfulness in their **Giving to Others** contributions but also as a result of prudent work by the Finance team. Two years ago we reported a

significant loss to the Assembly as a result of selling a number of investment funds that had not produced well for many years. This allowed our investment team to re-allocate those funds into investments which have been not only more stable, but have produced a stronger return on investment. Thank you for your willingness to trust us in making these important steps to building a stronger financial portfolio for the future. More importantly, this is allowing us to consider developing some initiatives which will help both local churches and pastors to ministry wellness.

b) Statistical Realities:

We have managed to see upward movement in only two of the six areas of measurement recorded in the graph above.

First, If we were asked to record only one thing that has ultimate meaning for us as a church – it would be ‘conversions’ ... and I am so very pleased to see that a significant number of people have come to faith through the work and ministry of our churches. It is also meaningful that almost every church was able to report a life changed. **Second**, It is also wonderful to see that the prime discipleship training ground for our church (SDMI - Sunday School and Discipleship Making) has also seen a significant increase of 16.5% over last year. 16 Churches have received recognition for significant growth in Discipleship groups this past year. Many of these are outreach ministries outside the walls of the church.

Our overall giving has declined for the fourth year in a row but I am so very pleased to report that our WEF giving is finally over 100% (the actual amount is \$312,000). But even more significant is that in addition to this, another \$315,000 was raised for approved specials – ***you have been an incredibly generous people.***

AM Attendance continues to decline. We are today lower in the number of people attending our worship events than we have been for a generation (40 or more years). In the past ten years we have lost almost one-third of all the people who were a part of the Sunday worship in our churches. That is over 1200 people! And for these past ten years the decline has been at a steady pace and at a 4% decline over the past four years.

There are lots of reasons that could be given to explain the downturn. I have spent a great deal of time trying to understand why this is and what it means.

- People will point to statistics such as those shared by Reginald Bibby indicating that, in general, there are fewer people attending church in Canada as a whole and more people than ever before who list their religious preference as ‘none’.
- Some will remind me that other denominations are finding it difficult as well, and I know that is a fact.
- We are told that the dynamic of a church should not be based on AM attendance alone. And that is true. I mentioned earlier that I am encouraged to see that there are an increasing number of people in Discipleship groups, whether that’s a small group, a Sunday school class, an outreach, or mentor groups. In fact 9 of our churches report higher numbers in this area than in their AM worship. I know these

churches and this is a part of an intentional missional effort to ‘go’ and to connect their people into the lives of others. That is a good thing.

- This is Christ’s Church and he said he will grow it. So maybe we should just relax and trust his promises.

I believe that this is Christ’s church and He will grow His church. I find comfort, each night, in being able to turn the business of the church over to Him. That does not, however, release us from taking responsibility and doing what we can to help fulfill our calling to be his agents. I see that our churches - communities of faith, the visible evidence of Christ’s presence in the world today, are struggling. The reality is that 200 fewer people this year find meaning in coming together for Worship one-with-another in our churches.

I am not satisfied with just saying our country has changed and our culture is not as receptive to the institutional church as in the past. I cannot find solace in the fact that we share this unfortunate trend with others. I will not ignore the tough reality that there are churches that ten to fifteen years ago were thriving and dynamic and today they have half as many people in attendance. They worry about surviving another ten years. I don’t want to be content with the reality that more and more of our pastor’s will have to become bi-vocational in order to survive. Dr. Alexander Ardrey, who passed away last month, was my first District Superintendent, and in many ways a coach and a mentor – and a tough teacher with high expectations for all of his pastors. He frustrated me to no end by seeming to always want just a bit more from me. When I finally found the courage to talk to him about it I remember him smiling slightly and then saying: *“Larry, it’s not that I am not satisfied with what you are doing – it’s just that I am never completely satisfied.”* As harsh as it sounded, I knew what he meant. He had a heart for seeing God’s Kingdom grow and churches to do more than just get by. He pushed himself as hard as he pushed his pastors. I think of his statement from time to time – and it always reminds me that there is still more that can be done. I don’t think any of you who are a part of our churches and will read this report and agonize over it as I do, want to settle for less either. I believe I know the heart of our pastors and their people – we want to see something more than what this report shows.

c) Celebrating Growing Churches:

It is right and appropriate for us to recognize those churches which have seen significant growth over the past year:

Great Growth: The indicators for Great Growth are: AM and SS (either stayed the same or grew); New Nazarenes (membership); Conversions; and contributed their *Giving to Others* in full. The church who have achieved this are:

Congratulations to these hard working congregations who have demonstrated fruitfulness for your labors this year. I believe and consistently tell people that the real work of the Church happens within the local congregation. You have had the chance already today to have heard the stories of what is happening in some of our churches. You will hear more of these tomorrow. I am deeply grateful to each person who has put themselves so completely into the work of Christ in their local church. Thank you hardly seems adequate, and I believe God will richly bless each one.

III. **A Dream and a Hope:**

I know we are oriented to 'hope' over despair. So despite my anxiousness about the ten years of decline we have experienced in morning worship attendance, and the cacophony

of voices speaking of forces beyond our control, I am convinced there are some things that can be done. Allow me, in closing, to dream a little and to hope a lot and to believe that the Church of Christ will live and thrive and be what this world needs us to be. Three things seem attainable this year.

First: To develop a strategy for reaching the major cities on our District. A layman from one of our Calgary churches confronted me with the question recently: *“What kind of plan or strategy do you have for our city?”* I confess to not answering his question very well. I wanted to say: *“That’s not my job.”* I wanted to say: *“Calgary’s not the only city I have to worry about, you know.”* I wanted to say: *“Well, we do have a plan – and here it is”* – but the fact is, I didn’t have one. And I didn’t say any of those things – and really didn’t give him much of a good answer at all. But it was a very good question! And I haven’t forgotten it – because *it is my job to think about how we will reach and impact this city ... and all the other large cities – and areas - that make up Canada West District.* And I have some ideas. So a plan – a dream – a hope – is to meet with pastors and key lay leaders in the major cities across our District to begin a process of developing a strategy for building a stronger kingdom presence. What the strategy will look and feel like needs to arise from the midst of those who give heart and soul for their communities. I am indebted to people like Dr. Joel Thiessen, one of our own right here at Ambrose, for helping me to see past the oppressive statistics that show a huge resistance to the church as an institution - and forward to “who”, “what” and “where” we can apply ourselves for greatest effect.

- Through ministries to new people groups who simply need to be loved, connected and cared for. A case in point I want to introduce you to Dr. David Nicholas and his new ministry taking place out of Edmonton First Church and simply called: Circle of Friends.
- Also through people who just offer what they have and are available for God to use them in even the most common of ways. A case in point I want to invite Glenn McDowell, a layman and strong part of the ministry of Edmonton Southside to share about his place of ministry and service.

Second: I would propose that we work at gaining a renewed perspective on our role in people’s lives that is truly missional. Mindset needs to come before method. Darrell MacLearn, in his workshop on Organic Church, pointed out something quite interesting. Jesus, as a carpenter, could have quite easily built a building if that was going to be the most important part of his kingdom. He, after all, had a model in place – the temple was the place people came to encounter God. Yet, what we see, in fact, is that he spent his years here on earth pouring himself into other people. And from Acts 8:4 we find the early church coming under persecution; it ‘scattered’ and took with it the message of the Gospel. *Every Christian was seen to be a missionary ... every house was seen to be a church ... every church was a training ground for missionaries.* David Skidmore is not able to be with us for this Assembly – but as he and I talked about how best to advance the challenge presented last year for everyone to begin to carry a burden for some place to serve. We felt there was a need for everyone to begin right where they are. Intentional discipleship with people we meet who have a hunger to learn more about

faith and life with Christ. We will be distributing to our pastor's a book that first came out a couple of years ago which outlines an idea *One Conversation at a Time*, by D. Michael Henderson. Additionally, we will present the challenge of each person developing intentional disciple making through relationships based on a model called: Life Transformation Groups.

- To understand how it works I have asked Rev. Bryan Roller to share how he has implemented several of these within the context of his own very busy life as a pastor.

Thirdly: In 2007, Lifeway Research did a study that revealed that 70% of Protestant adults between the ages of 18-22 stopped attending church regularly. In their analysis it revealed that in spite of many churches having revamped their images and re-oriented their worship experiences specifically for that group, youth were still leaving the church. In his live interviews with youth, Joel Thiessen discovered that the majority of youth have had little or no experience with the church but still carry with them a fairly negative image of what church is like. Brett McCracken, a twenty-something commented in an article in the Wall Street Journal: *"... I can say with confidence that when it comes to church, we don't want cool as much as we want real. If we are interested in Christianity in any sort of serious way, it is not because it's easy or trendy or popular. It's because Jesus himself is appealing, and what he says rings true."*

Before we set out to discover what youth today want in church it seems that it might be more important for us to begin with a conversation with the young adults who continue to attend our churches and find out from them what they need in the church for today and the future. With that in mind we will institute a series of informal conversations across the District with young adults within our churches to discern how the church can remain relevant and vital to their own faith and life.

Your prayer support remains vital. Audrey and I continue to have a deep appreciation for those moments when you convey to us that you are caring for us in this most meaningful way. We both love the work of the Church, this District, and her people.

2. Business Administrator

2010-2011

2010 – 2011 has been an encouraging year! First, let me take this opportunity to thank you for the gift of a sabbatical, which was a life changing event for me. Secondly, I would like to thank you all for your participation in *giving to others* this year. It's been encouraging to hear the positive response to this "tithes and offerings" model for giving. You might be interested to know that every church on our district participated. Sixteen churches contributed more than the 14% that was requested (5.5% for World Evangelism Fund and 8.5% for District and Education). Additionally, nearly \$350,000 was given by our churches to other global interests and approved specials. That is over and above the World evangelism fund amounts given. Though all we see here are the numbers on the page, it's exciting to know the many lives that have been touched through our sacrificial giving.

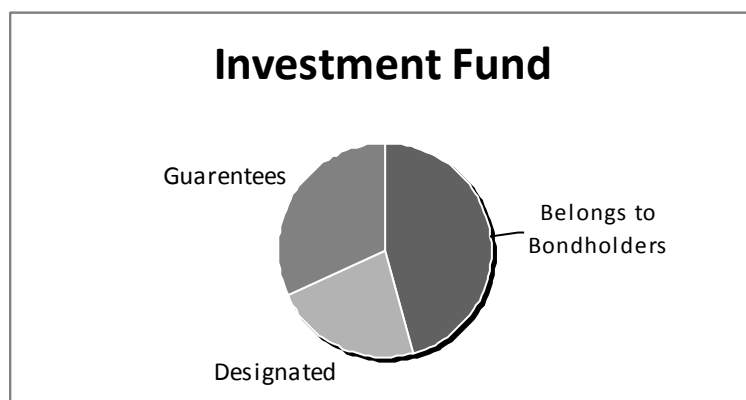
Following is a summary of the administrative activities along with some important information.

1. Financial

First, I would like to respond to a question that has come my way several times this year.

Question: Since the district has 4.4 million dollars in the investment fund, why does our church still need to send support to the district? AND why can't our church have some of that money?

Answer: We don't own 4.4 million dollars. Of the 4.4 million dollars the district manages, 2 million belongs to bond holders. Of the remaining 2.4 million dollars, about 1 million is designated funds. Using the remaining 1.4 million dollars, we have guaranteed loans for Siloam mission and some of our churches. This is why we can't give away the money. The other reason is that we use the return on these investments to ensure the percentage of giving to others that local churches are asked to give is moderated. If we did not have return on investment, the percentage we would need to ask local churches to contribute would increase by at least 50%. PLUS on years when our investments do well, we are able to start initiatives that will benefit local churches. In the coming year there will be 9 such initiatives!



The other good thing the Investment fund does is make it possible for churches and individuals to experience higher return on their investments than they would if they invested in any other similar fund. Currently bondholders receive 1.75% for those with \$50,000 or less in the fund, 2% for those with \$50,000 - \$100,000 in the fund and 2.75% for those with \$100,000 or more in the fund. These rates are reviewed regularly to ensure we remain competitive. Please consider investing with us.

- a. As mentioned above, this year was the first year for *Giving to others* according to the new system. In over viewing the year end reports, it is apparent most churches are calculating correctly and further instruction will be given to those that need it.
- b. Some notable information pertaining to our annual finance statements includes:
 - i. We ended the year with a \$5,049.24 surplus.
 - ii. Our total assets increased from 4.3 million to 7 million largely due to the addition of Camp Harmattan to our books. Camp Harmattan has always been the property of Canada West District Church of the Nazarene but was not on the books. In the coming year, Lakeshore camp property value will also be added to our books. We are currently researching to determine the appropriate value to add.
 - iii. Since land is an appreciating asset and with the agreement of our financial reviewer, Camp Harmattan and the District office depreciation will not be shown on our books.
- c. It has been encouraging to see our Investment picture improving. Over the past several years, changes have been made in our structure and procedures towards this end, including the following:
 - i. Protection of the principle of the Investment account so that these funds can continue to produce return on investment that may be used to:
 1. Ensure the percentage of *Giving to others* requested from local churches is kept low.
 2. Produce income for ministry now and for future generations.
 - ii. Diversifying to include property investments and property type investments.
 - iii. Instituting a Special management fund.
 - iv. Education regarding the value of investing in the District fund.

- v. Leasing of the District office.
 - vi. Giving attention to the net value of our account; implementing new procedures in our investment account to ensure positions sold at a loss are offset by positions sold at a gain.
 - vii. Eliminate positions that have been experiencing long term depletion.
 - viii. Reducing the budgeted return on investment to avoid over-projection.
 - ix. Careful budgeting, identifying “optional” expenses and aligning expenditures based on actual return on investment and *giving to others*.
 - x. Creation of reserve accounts to preserve the principle of funds set aside for initiatives such as the Ambrose liaison.
- d. Ten Finance committee meetings were held. Committee members are: Larry Dahl, Don Goings, Dorothy Low, Bill Parkins, Ken Walker and myself. Finance statements were reviewed on a monthly basis.
- e. The annual District Assembly Finance committee meeting was held.
- f. The 2011-2012 budget was completed and approved by the Finance Committee, the District Advisory Board and the District Assembly Finance committee. The budget setting procedure follows this report on page 31, for your perusal. In this year’s budget we are pleased to report the following:
- i. Provision of funds to subsidize Pastoral couples to attend the Focus on the Family guided retreat at Kerith Creek.
 - ii. Continued support for Ambrose and our Nazarene students has been provided. Along with the employing the Ambrose liaison, we continue to connect with Nazarene students at Ambrose through participation in the Servant leadership scholarship program. New this year is subsidy for churches participating in hiring an Ambrose student as an intern.
 - iii. Additional funds allotted towards the following, noted below. It is our prayers that these that the result of these initiatives will be an abundant over flow in to the local church.
 1. Clergy Conference
 2. Travel subsidy for those in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Peace Country.
 3. District Assembly
 4. Retired elders subsidy to attend District assembly, prayer retreat and Clergy Conference
 5. Young adult focus group
 6. Support for Lakeshore camp
 7. High Prairie Work and Witness project
 8. Organic Church

9. A contingency fund for responding to critical situations.
 - g. An independent review of the 2009-2010 finances has been done. We responded to the items identified for attention in the review. A 2010-2011 review will be performed soon.
 - h. A loan was made to Camp Harmattan.
 - i. The Canada West District obtained an agency agreement to allow us to transfer funds to Cuba.
 - j. Transitional assistance was granted to Winnipeg New Hope Church.
2. Communications
 - a. In the Loop newsletter was sent out monthly.
 - b. Regular updates were made to the district website. www.cwdnazarne.org
3. Conferences. The following conferences and retreats were held:
 - a. District Assembly and Conventions
 - b. Clergy conference – 100 plus in attendance
 - c. Prayer retreats – 30 Pastors in attendance
 - d. Assessment Center – 6 Candidates attended, 4 were recommended
 - e. Organic Church
 - f. Board of Ministry – 20 Candidates attended
 - g. Pastor Development Days – 28 Pastors attended
 - h. Palcon was hosted on our district – 43 Canada West District Pastors attended
4. Properties
 - a. The District office became taxable due to the fact that it is now leased. Our annual revenue from the leasing of the office is currently \$36,000.00 less expenses. A temporary tenant will be moving in upstairs in July, increasing our revenue.
 - b. Last year the district purchased a revenue property in Calgary, It is rented for \$1200 a month, less expenses, with a net gain of 3% plus the long term property appreciation.
 - c. The district cosigned a loan with Calgary First and Siloam mission.
5. Policies and Procedures
 - a. The Board of Ministry policy and procedure manual was updated and approved.
 - b. A key employee succession plan was developed.
 - c. Several new policies, including an anti-fraud policy, were written.
 - d. The Office Procedures manual was approved.
 - e. The Siloam mission policy manual was updated and approved.
 - f. The Finance Policy and Procedure manual was created.
6. Legal

- a. Consultations were held regarding several matters relating to local churches.
 - b. Lakeshore’s T3010-1 was completed.
 - c. Chaplaincy contracts were renewed.
 - d. All provincial and federal filings were completed.
7. Insurance, LTD, RSP
- a. The Blue Cross Benefit Plus plan was renewed with a slight increase to premiums, but less than the cost of living increase.
 - b. The Customized Blue Cross plan for full time employees was renewed. It was noted that although cost of living increase this year was 16% for drugs and 6.5% for dental, our plan increased only 1% indicating a healthy use of the plan. (Our increase was below cost of living for the second year in a row!!) All components are being used but not overused. As a reminder, if the cost of your prescriptions for any one person on the plan will be higher than \$5000., per year, please contact the district office and you will be enrolled in a supplementary plan at no cost to you. This will moderate any increases to our group plan. A document summarizing and comparing the two plans was created and can be found following this report (Page 33). Additionally a rate chart has been provided for your reference (page 32).
 - c. RBC Long Term disability plan was renewed with a small increase. The increase was due to the number of people on the plan who turned 50 this year. Happy Birthday to all of you though. ☺ We have had one pastor make use of our LTD coverage and we have been very pleased with the support and help provided by RBC.
 - d. This year we are pleased to have a representative from Great West Life presenting at our assembly to better acquaint RSP plan members of the most advantageous way to participate in the plan. Additionally, we have determined that part time employees are now able to enroll in the RSP plan.

2. Ambrose University College Chancellor

□ Academic

- Enrolment this fall was 652 students [+3.99%]; 499 undergraduate [+4.83%] and 153 Seminary [+1.32%]; 339 female & 313 male students.
- 111 students graduated on Saturday, April 30.
- Joel Thiessen [Skyview Church] successfully defended his dissertation at the University of Waterloo and is now Dr. Joel Thiessen.
- On February 1, Board Chair Alex Baum, Program Head Dr. Bernie Potvin, and President Howard Wilson travelled to Edmonton at the invitation of Dave Hancock, Minister of Education for the Province of Alberta to sign an historic agreement with the government to accept Ambrose Bachelor of Education graduates as provisionally certified teachers and to be welcomed into the

company of Alberta schools with education degrees. The other seven universities with education programs were also present to sign agreements.

- Public lecture events on campus this spring included:
 - Dr. Reginald Bibby, on religious activity in Canada, based on his new book, Beyond the Gods and Back. This was part of the Clergy Days series on our districts this spring sponsored by Ambrose and the National Board.
 - Dr. David Fitch, on *The End of Evangelicalism* [the title of his new book.]

□ **Student activities**

- Ambrose participated in the National Survey of Student Engagement [NSSE] this winter, which meant that we were listed in some of the categories' in the 2011 edition of *Maclean's* university rankings. Our ranking nationally was:
 - 6th in "Would you go back to school at your university?" among first year students and 11th amongst graduating students.
 - 4th in "Supportive Campus Environment".
 - 7th in "Enriching Educational Experience".

When we become full members of AUCC we will be included in the entire rating system.

- The Alberta Colleges Athletic Conference [ACAC] leadership has approved our application to compete in their conference in futsal [indoor soccer] in 2012. This is the next step for us in athletic competition. ACAC includes SAIT, NAIT, Mount Royal University, etc. We will need to add an additional sport for both genders by 2014; our goal is to have all our teams competing at the ACAC level.
- We are partnering with Rundle College [a private school adjacent to our campus] in the near future to use their new \$2M football and soccer field for a new soccer program, beginning in fall 2011.
- We hosted Lorna Dueck from Listen UP TV at our Global Impact Day and there was good student engagement with her on the topic of civic engagement. Preston Manning will be our Global Impact speaker in 2012.
- We have had several excellent music concerts in the past few months. Our music program is growing in enrollment and in quality, and we are attracting a good number of new music students for fall 2011. Our Chamber Singers toured in Italy in May.

□ **Campus activities**

- The **Legacy Youth Conference** in March attracted 620 delegates. Including sponsors and Ambrose students, 1000 people participated in a great weekend of music, ministry, and discipleship. Nazarene Pastor Stuart Williams was the featured speaker.
 - Ambrose hosted the **Nazarene Student Leadership Conference** in April, with 140 delegates from the ten U.S. Nazarene Colleges and Universities on campus. Our entire student leadership team is planning to attend next year's conference at Eastern Nazarene College.
 - Ambrose hosted the **Finishing Well** retreat for seniors May 16-18. The two featured speakers were Dr. Charles Price, pastor of People's Church in Toronto and Dr. Sean Campbell, former Executive Director of Samaritan's Purse in Canada and now ED of The Lotus Group. Over 260 seniors participated in the event.
- **Finances**
- Revenue was \$12.25M; Expenses were \$11.75M.
 - We are carrying \$18M debt on our campus; \$10M is in a longer term, fixed-rate mortgage, \$8M is in a flexible mortgage. We paid \$500K on our flexible rate mortgage during the year.
 - To date, \$1.9M has been given toward the \$7.4M cost of the **New Residence and Education Centre**; thank you for your support of this project. The building will be completed this August, providing a home for our Bachelor of Education students and campus housing for 96 more students.
- **CNC Board of Directors**
- The CNC Board of Directors met in January; Dr. Coulter was elected for a further five year term as President of CNC Ltd, the trustee of the Nazarene presence and investment in Ambrose. During the meeting, the board considered the questions, *"How can Ambrose University College more effectively serve the Church of the Nazarene in Canada"* and *"How can we, the Church of the Nazarene in Canada more effectively serve and partner with Ambrose in the education of the next generation of leaders for our church?"*

We are deeply grateful for the support we receive from our Nazarene churches across Canada. Denominational, church and individual giving provides about 25% of our operating budget and allows us to keep tuition costs affordable for our students. This year our graduating students will go out and make an impact for Christ in ministry, on the mission field, and in the

marketplace. The education they received at Ambrose has provided the necessary skills but also the spiritual development they need to change a church, a community – and even a world.

Dr. Clair and Donna MacMillan, Dr. Larry and Audrey Dahl, Linda Braatan, local NMI presidents, pastors and spouses, delegates, members and friends of Nazarene Missions International of this, the 63rd Annual Canada West District NMI Convention. This is my fourth, and final, report as your district president.

I was raised on a farm in central Alberta. My parents had a mixed farming operation which means they raised cattle, pigs, and chickens and also cereal crops. Each spring my father planned for seeding. One of the ways he planned was to try to find good seed. Usually he kept some grain from the previous year. However he needed to know if the seed was good seed. Would it bring a good harvest? If you don't have good seed, your harvest will not be the best. He would get some grain from one of the bins and plant those seeds in soil in some type of container which was kept in the house. The number of grains planted was carefully counted. The container was placed near a window and watered. After some time, when those green shoots appeared, they were counted. From this result, a decision was made as to which seeds would be used. We, too, as NMI supporters are planting seeds. Jesus used the common items of the farmers in His day as illustrations in His stories. In Mark, chapter 4, we read the parable of the sower casting seed and also about the mustard seed, being so tiny, but when it has grown, it produces a great harvest. We, too, can cast seed which may produce a harvest of souls for God.

The mission of the Church of the Nazarene is to make Christ-like disciples. Nazarene Missions International (NMI) is an integral part of the church. There are four ways in which we can cast seeds.

The first seed, and probably the most important, is **Prayer**. The Bible has much to say about prayer. We are encouraged to bring our requests to God. "And pray in the spirit on all occasions with all kinds of prayers and requests. With this in mind, be alert and always keep on praying for all the saints". (Ephesians 6:18). These prayers may be for our own concerns but also on behalf of the requests of others.

Mike and Diane went from Alaska to help with the building of the hospital in Papua New Guinea. They tell of a season last fall when there was an extended time period during which no

rain fell in Papua New Guinea. People had to walk a long distance to get water. The gardens and water supplies had dried up. This situation caused high stress levels. People in Papua New Guinea and elsewhere prayed for rain. Then on Nov. 9, it began to rain!! God answered the prayers of many.

Last summer saw a new venture in the Ukraine. They held the first-ever Boys Camp where 52 people from various parts of the country came together. The idea behind the camp was to bring teenage boys and Christian men together for fellowship and to share the experience of a life rooted in Christ. Many of the boys came from broken families and tough backgrounds. As a result, many associated adult manhood with drinking, foul language and violent behavior. The pastor of Kyiv First Church of the Nazarene said, "We wanted to provide the boys with an opportunity to see the Christian alternative for their lives, to help them realize that they are the beloved children of a Heavenly Father." Some of these young fellows gave their hearts to Christ by the time the camp was over. Thanks to those who prayed and to God for that change. A camp was also held for girls. During that time God worked in the hearts of all those present, which included both the speakers and those who came to be campers and counselors. Heike Wright also wrote of the baptism of eleven people. Some of the candidates had been living on the streets as children or came from abusive homes. Your prayers for Ukraine and the Wrights, who were at our family camp a few years ago, were answered during these events. I trust you will be encouraged to be faithful in praying for our missionaries. Even when we do not see immediate results, know that God is at work.

NMI provides several resources for giving you information about prayer requests. You may sign up to receive the Prayer Mobilization Line. If you have any concerns about how to do this, please see me, or one of our council members, who will help you. Your district NMI council spent some time this past year in discussing how to have you receive prayer requests. Almost all are available on line, so in your booklet you will find a list of those sites. This means that you can access the ones that you wish. The individual missionary prayer requests will be sent to you. The reason for this is that we did not feel it was wise to send those e-mail addresses to you.

But for all organizations, who regularly put out prayer requests, you will be able to access these yourself. It is our hope that you will inform your local congregation of particular prayer needs, whether in your weekly bulletin, on a bulletin board or even by e-mail.

Another important seed is that of **Discipling**. This is a means by which others, younger or older, catch the vision of missions. It is exciting to see that God is speaking to many about ways to serve Him.

The local church can be involved in developing tomorrow's missionaries. Attention can be given to those, particularly children and youth, who feel a calling to ministry/or cultural missions and/or who want to be global Christians, even if not formally on the mission field. Get to know that young person, invest time in their life and help them grow spiritually. Discipling leaders would begin at the local church level and develop through intentional, interpersonal relationships.

Involving youth in Work and Witness is a great tool for developing future mission minded leaders. I know that this has happened on this district. One team had children involved. Another had young people involved. One team went to share Kidztown. They not only demonstrated a Kidztown ministry but also helped those who witnessed their ministry develop their own version of Kidztown. Some young adults have participated in cross cultural ministries with other organizations. It is a blessing to see these young people involved in ministry. May God continue to call and bless many others. Many missionaries have indicated that their first interest in missions came as a result of participating in a Work and Witness trip.

The Missions packet for children, put out by NMI, is a wonderful tool for getting children interested and involved in missions. Listening to a visiting missionary at the local church or, Harmattan Family Camp, provides another opportunity for children and youth to hear about missions. I would encourage each church to involve children and youth in missions whenever possible. There can also be involvement at the local level; that is helping in a local project or with a nearby church or Compassionate Ministry Center.

Education is another important objective of NMI. There are many ways to plant the seed about missions. The curriculum for adults is called "Living Missions." Some changes have been made in this comparatively new material. If you order the box containing the material, you will receive information for the whole year in the original box. You will not have to wait for the rest of the material to be sent part way through the year. Also an attempt has been made to include more stories from mission fields. Many of you will find the quarterly DVD to be useful as it has short stories/information which is suitable for use in AM services. The books for adults and children are excellent resources for the local church.

Listening to a presentation by a missionary is inspiring and informational. We were privileged to have four missionaries tour our district this year. I hope you were able to hear one of them. They each gave very interesting information about their respective ministries. It is exciting to know that God is using modern technology to further His kingdom. Brian told of many opportunities for radio to reach where a person could not go. While radio is not a major means of information in our culture; it is in many areas of the world. A new radio program for adults was to begin this spring in South Africa. A radio program in the Bengali language in Sri Lanka has hopes to produce the program in five more languages. By doing this, it would reach the majority of unreached people in South Asia. Josh , who provides support for programs and leaders in South America, is able to work from the U.S. via means of computers!!

Our project this past year was to assist our missionary in Madagascar. He and his wife operate a compassionate ministry center to help the street children in their city. Our project goal was \$5,000. The children at Harmattan Family Camp, under Pastor Bob Tattrie's leadership, raised over \$3,000. Many of you have been most generous in supporting this project as our goal was exceeded by a great amount. Our treasurer reported that over \$10,000 was received. This means that 50+ children will have food, clothing, education, medical care, and Bible studies for a year. Thank you and God bless for your generosity.

Another seed we sow is that of **Giving**. This involves not only giving of dollars but also of time and energies. Generous support has been given to those in need in your local community. This has been through: Food Bank, Christmas Food Hampers, Disaster Relief, Soup Kitchen and various other types of assistance. Support for Compassionate Ministry Centers has been on your hearts, too.

Offerings for missionaries on tour have been outstanding. From reports which I have received around \$50,000 has been sent in to our National Office for 10% Mission Specials. This includes items such as: community wells, animals, Pakistan Flood relief, unsponsored children, fruit trees and garden seeds. Some churches also work with Canadian Food Grains Bank.

The World Evangelism Fund continues to be the major resource for supporting all of our missionaries. Changes have taken place in the way this support is given and also in the amount raised. The Global Mission Council is looking at downsizing as a result of WEF income being less. Three years ago total contributions to WEF peaked at nearly \$49 million. The General Church is now planning on total WEF giving for 2012 to be approximately \$37 million. To reduce the impact on our world mission outreach efforts, the Global Ministry Center reduced its budget by \$3 million this year and is planning on another \$3 million reduction in 2012. To reduce this budget, the number of employees will decrease, salaries and travel are being reduced and support staff (not missionaries) in various regional offices will be less.

I am not sure how our district compares in WEF giving from last year to this year. However the information which I have, indicates participation by almost all churches on the Canada West District. Thank you for your support of missions through the World Evangelization Fund and is imperative that we continue this support. No doubt, Dr. Dahl will be able to provide you with more accurate information about giving to WEF on our district later this week.

Although these statistics could be discouraging, the General church is committed to expand in reaching new generations/cultures for Christ. The Church of the Nazarene has seen vigorous growth in some world areas.

For example:

- Eurasia region experienced double-digit growth, 500 new churches organized.
- Bangladesh has gone from 1 church to 1,224 in ten years.
- Pastors from India have committed to planting 4,500 new churches in next 5 years.
- Africa has more than half-million members.
- Haiti received nearly 1 million pounds of food, water and relief supplies after their devastating earthquake; and there is spontaneous revival.

We do not need to be discouraged!! God can take what seems to be difficult and use these circumstances for His glory.

Most of all, I thank God. Many times, He has given guidance and strength. His Word is a source of encouragement and direction. I praise God for His mercy and grace to me. Truly, "God is (my) refuge and strength, an ever present help in trouble.The Lord Almighty is with (me)." (Psalms 46:1, 7)

Jesus calls us to sow seeds for Him. Across the world, missionaries, pastors and laymen in different countries, cultures and situations are sowing gospel seeds for Christ. NMI seeks to be a means to assist these missionaries, pastors and nationals. Our desire on this district, Canada West, is to be supportive, by praying, discipling, informing and giving. As a council we wish to help you in the local church in whatever way we can.

You may say Nazarene Missions has changed; it's not what I remember! That may be true. But the basics have not changed. Many across our world have not yet heard of God's love for each one. We can pray, give and become knowledgeable. Those seeds can still be sown. May we each in the words of an old hymn: "sow seeds of kindness;... sow in the sunshine or the shadows;...Go then,...We shall come rejoicing, bringing in the sheaves (harvest)" (My adaptation). COMMUNICATION:

The second challenge in front of me was to do my part in trying to open up more communication with our pastors and local leaders. I hope that the at least bi-weekly emails with resourcing and information were useful. I would also challenge you as leaders in SDMI to contact me, or another committee member to discuss potential ministry opportunities that might be of interest to others, as it is a vital part of working together that we communicate not only our results through the statistics, but as well, the real “results” that come from changed lives, and how a life changed in your community might help another community reach the same goal. I’ve had several conversations with pastors on a wide-range of topics this year, including “why again do we report statistically what we do?” and how the statistics might be better used to not just measure what has happened but also to envision the possibilities of lives open to Christ in the future. We have also had several inquiries about issues related to the safe place policies and I hope some of those questions will be address through a new Global ministry of the Nazarene Church called NazareneSafe. I hope that you will continue to seek out these conversations in order to help each other to do the work we are called to do.

CONVENTION:

This last area I wanted to focus on was to continue to do the work of providing an information and more importantly, inspirational day for our SDMI leaders. Believe me when I say that this day, and the good things that may happen today, is really only possible because of the district office and the leadership of Rose Graham and her team there. Her constant emails about “where is this?” and “have you decided that?” were so helpful in the planning. All the good things are to her credit, and I’ll take the constructive criticism for any of you if there is something you would like to see differently about this convention time. We are trying a new thing this year, or rather, something that hasn’t been done in awhile, in hosting round table discussions about certain ministries, both by local church leaders and some of your SDMI district team. We hope that today and into the future, this day becomes one you look forward to attending each year.

THE FUTURE:

It is true that all this deliberation and discussion MUST lead to action in order for us to be effective leaders. I would like to briefly outline some of what we HOPE will be a part of what develops over the next few years for District SDMI

- We would hope that each church will become a full participant in *NazareneSafe*, guidelines offered by the Global Church to establish policies and procedures for protecting minors and preventing sexual misconduct in the church. As hard as it is to believe that this has to be a focus of our local ministries, the Global Church has adopted a zero tolerance policy in this area. This is no longer just an insurance compliance issue

but rather, a way of positioning our churches as authentic communities that are doing what they can to protect those who are a part. After attending a full day of seminars relating to *NazareneSafe* at the District Leadership Conference, I came away sobered and serious about helping our churches implement stronger safe place policies. In order to do this, your District SDMI Board has approved a \$25 rebate for each enrolment by a local church in this program for the first year. We encourage you to try it, even if you already feel you are doing the job of keeping your children and young people safe.

- Marilyn Gripping as Children’s Ministry Director, is in the very beginning stages of working with professors and students at Ambrose to work through providing online supplements to our Sunday School material in order to help churches who find it difficult to staff a full Sunday School in their local churches.
- As well, we are quite hopeful that in the next year to 18 months, we will be able to offer online “courses” of training, especially for Sunday School teachers to equip them on various issues.
- It is also exciting to announce that the Ministry Development Centers that are doing the work of training our pastors, have authorized the offering of the Course of Study Audit Track free of charge to local churches who would like to use these materials for Sunday School purposes. More information will be available in the Fall of 2011.
- We hope to continue to develop an ever increasing network of communication in order to resource churches and their leaders.

Thank you...

I would be remiss if I didn’t thank the ones who really DO the ministry of SDMI across our district ~ our local pastors, and pastoral staff, as well as Sunday School Superintendents and Teachers and Small Group Leaders. The work of Sunday School and Discipleship is broad and deep and requires dedication to the extreme. Thank you to all local leaders for their hard work.

Thank you too, to Dr. Dahl, whose long time dedication to SDMI on this district, and supportive and encouraging spirit were so helpful as I waded through this first year of SDMI leadership.

As well, special thanks goes to Donna Martynes, whose tireless work in collecting the statistics each month is to be commended. I encourage you to make her job easier by making sure you have a consistent report each month.

Thanks too, to my very patient family... for David as he took extra time off while I worked or traveled for SDMI to care for our children; and to Katelyn and Josiah, who have, at times, had to wait for Mom to “be done” with her work. Thank you.

And to make this work very personal, I must say that my two little ones are two of the many reasons why it is such a privilege to be a part of this team. As a mother, I see the hope for the future of my children and their faith in the work of the local church in helping me disciple them to salvation and sanctification. The Church of the Nazarene has been in continuous operation in Canada since 1902. Shortly following World War II, the Government of Canada enacted legislation requiring every charitable receipt-granting organization to be supervised by a nationally incorporated board of directors, resident within the country. "The Executive Board of the Church of the Nazarene in Canada" was incorporated in 1946 by an act of parliament. It was empowered by the General Board of the Church of the Nazarene to be the "lawful authority of the Church of the Nazarene in Canada in all matters relative to the acquiring, holding, selling and conveying of property within the Dominion, as outlined in the Articles of Incorporation." This responsibility continues to be the core of our responsibility.

Over the past 50 years – and particularly in the past decade – the role and responsibility of the National Church Corporation has continued to evolve. Two factors have influenced that development. First, changes in governmental regulations that affect us; and second, the unique opportunities that come our way to act on behalf of the Church of the Nazarene International in responding to needs in various parts of the world.

National Director's Responsibilities

National Office

In recent years, the Church of the Nazarene International has increasingly called upon us to manage its interests within Canada and through Canada, in many areas around the world. Through the National Office we handle payroll and retirement services for our Canadian missionaries. We manage the compliance issues that arise with the government regarding taxation and other employment matters for our and other church employees. We manage the retirement accounts for our pastors and oversee the group insurance plan, which covers our pastors and their families.

We also manage the Joint Ministry Agreement with the Church of the Nazarene International. This agreement has been necessitated by ongoing changes in government regulations concerning money given for charitable purposes. By law, Canadian churches are forbidden to transfer funds outside of Canada unless they have a written agreement in place to track and verify the use of those funds. This agreement is the product of many months of complex negotiations between our tax lawyer, Mr. Robert Hayhoe, and the General Church legal counsel, Maurice O'Sullivan.

In order to be compliant with the above mentioned agreement, the Church of the Nazarene International maintains a holding account to receive all World Evangelism Funds, mission specials, and other income from our Canadian churches. That account can only be accessed by

the General Treasurer and General Secretary of the Church of the Nazarene International; virtually all Church of the Nazarene funds moving into and out of Canada flow through this account. We continue to adapt to these changing requirements to assure that our districts and local churches remain in compliance with all current law.

Through the National Office we operate the Church Loan Fund Canada, arranging financing to local churches for acquiring or developing properties. Currently we have about \$2.5 million on loan to local churches. This fund is made available particularly to churches that would have difficulty qualifying for financing in the commercial loan market.

The National Office maintains a website; we publish a weekly newsletter, edited by Diane McCrae. It is distributed by email to hundreds of individuals and all of our local churches. Dr. William Stewart publishes a quarterly newsletter he calls ACORN (Association of Canadian Retired Nazarenes); it is distributed to retired Nazarene pastors and laypeople across Canada and around the world.

The National Office, in cooperation with Nazarene Compassionate Ministries Canada (NCCM), coordinates the Canadian participation in the Child Sponsorship program of the General Church.

These are exceedingly complex and time consuming activities. Our National Office staff is made up of my Executive Assistant, Alan McAlpin, our bookkeeper, and our office assistant, Diane McCrae. All National Office staff work on a part-time basis. The International Church of the Nazarene pays us to manage their interests on its behalf.

When I accepted this position, the National Board asked me to give attention to four priorities in addition to being the executive officer of the corporation.

District Coordination

First, the Board asked me to help to develop and optimize resources for the districts and the district superintendents.

Financial Resources

Prior to 1997 each of the districts applied for and received financial assistance for home mission work from the International Department of Home Missions. Since 1997, the USA/CANADA Mission Evangelism Department has eliminated that program and decided that it will provide an annual "block funding grant" to the Canadian Church, on condition that we develop a system of sharing those funds among the Canadian districts. We have an ongoing commitment to assure that those funds are used where they will do the most good. We thank Dr. Robert Broadbooks and the USA/CANADA Mission Department for this ongoing support.

We do not receive any funding from local churches to operate the National Office or any of the initiatives the districts ask us to undertake on their behalf. We do have a small amount of income that comes to us from the annual proceeds of investments that have been committed to us over the years. We are seeking ways to expand that resource, in order to make more funds available to advance the work of the districts. During the past year we have channeled about \$150,000 to the 5 Canadian Districts for the operation of their home missions programs.

Other Resources

Last summer I worked in cooperation with the 5 Canadian Districts, Ambrose University College, the General Church and our local churches to sponsor the Pastoral Leadership Conference PALCON. We had over 110 pastors and pastoral staff on campus at Ambrose. This continuing education event proved to be a spiritual highlight for all who participated. I thank the staff at Office of Clergy Services at the Global ministry Center for their initiative and skill in planning this event.

We continue to make the ***SourceBook for Clergy Development*** available at no cost on our National website and on the International Church website. This important resource continues to influence the preparation of ministers for the church. We are beginning reap the benefits of this tool that has been part of our process of clergy preparation for the past 17 years.

I continue to conduct the annual Ministry Assessment program initiated by my predecessor 17 years ago. In January 2011 we led 6 candidates and their spouses through the assessment process in Calgary. I thank Dr. Larry Dahl and his executive assistant, Rose Graham, for coordinating and facilitating that process. Each of the candidates was assessed as “possessing the gifts and graces for clergy-type ministry in the Church of the Nazarene.” The March Assessment Center included candidates from Canada Central District; we assessed 7 candidates and spouses.

Rev. Terry Fach continues to serve us as our Regional Education Coordinator and oversee the work of the Canadian Region Course of Study Advisory Committee (RCOSAC). RCOSAC is currently working with the Academic Vice President of Ambrose University to have the ministry preparation program validated for ordination.

We are pleased with the continued development of Ambrose University College in its role of preparing people for service as lay people and as clergy. We see the role of Ambrose as making a most significant contribution to fulfilling our National Vision, particularly in raising another generation of competent and Spirit-filled leaders. We thank Dr. Riley Coulter, President of Canadian Nazarene College Inc. and Chancellor of Ambrose University College for his ongoing work on our behalf.

Former National Director, Dr. William Stewart has recently published a follow-up to his widely popular book, ***Journey into Holiness***. Dr. Stewart new book, ***Journey into Prayer***, follows the same literary style as the former and is currently available from him or from the National Office.

Quebec

Since June 2007 I have served as the acting superintendent of the Quebec District. Recently the Board of General Superintendents has asked me to continue in that capacity for another 2 years. It is understood by the BGS and the National Board to be a part of my assignment as National Director. Our goal in this is to transition to a more sustainable model for the continuation of the Quebec District as a discreet entity. The ongoing financial crisis in funding

the mission of the global church has impacted our progress toward that goal. The Quebec operation is seriously under-funded so I do this work *pro bono*.

I have met with the Quebec District Advisory Board six times this year and with the auxiliary leaders twice. I attended the Quebec Nazarene Youth International Convention last January and the Nazarene Missions International Convention in May. I am encouraged by the quality of leaders who are emerging in these important ministries. All our Quebec Churches have pastors in place.

Dr. Jocelyn Severe serves as Haitian Coordinator for Quebec. Under his leadership we have started 4 new “church-type” missions in the past two years. Dr. Severe also coordinates (and teaches in) “L’institut Biblique Nazareen du Quebec,” our delivery system for basic clergy preparation.

Nancy Robichaud is my part time Executive Assistant in Quebec. She provides the day-to-day oversight of our work.

Peer Accountability for District Superintendents

Second, the Board asked that I develop a system of peer accountability for the Canadian district superintendents. To that end, we have made a commitment to meet regularly to pray with and for one another, and to maintain the highest degree of spiritual transparency as we work to advance the Gospel in our respective fields of responsibility. I believe that God is honoring this initiative. We work together in two ways: first, as the Executive Committee of the National Board; and second, as the “Administrator’s Fellowship.”

When we meet as “Administrator’s Fellowship” we usually include our wives and share a time of relaxed conversation and enjoyable activity. We intentionally avoid “talking shop” during these times and focus on keeping the joy of holiness alive in us. Without exception we have come to anticipate and relish these times of renewal.

As the Executive committee we give prayerful consideration to the concerns and ministry opportunities that arise between the meetings of the Board. We work together to assure that as a denomination in Canada we keep faith with the mission that Good has given to the Church of the Nazarene.

Mission and Vision

Third, the Board asked me to keep us focused on the National Vision Statement it developed and adopted a decade ago. This statement coordinates well with our new statement of purpose adopted by the Board of General superintendents, “*Our purpose is to make Christ-like disciples in the nations.*”

Vision Statement Church of the Nazarene Canada

We the people in Canada called Nazarenes

*Commit ourselves to obeying the Father, honoring the Son and living in the Spirit by
engaging in effective evangelism, experiencing and promoting the holy life and
raising a generation of competent and Spirit filled leaders.*

Representing the Church of the Nazarene Canada

Fourth, the Board asked me to be the spokesman for the Church of the Nazarene and its representative in the larger church community and the wider society. In this capacity I have had ongoing contact with a number of organizations including, ALPHA Canada, Arrow Leadership Development, Church Planting Canada, The Micah Challenge, Church Growth Canada, The Christian and Missionary Alliance in Canada, the Wesleyan Church, the Evangelical Fellowship of Canada, the Interfaith Chaplaincy Committee and Bridges of Love – Urban Ministry. I continue to serve the Canadian Districts as our representative on the Church of the Nazarene District Superintendent’s Advisory Committee. New opportunities are arising constantly for us to take our place among other organizations that are seeking to make the Gospel of Jesus Christ known in our world.

Rev. Earl Wood continues to represent us on the Interfaith Chaplaincy Committee for Corrections Canada. The philosophy of Interfaith and of Corrections Canada is expressed in the motto, Restorative Justice. It is worthy of note that the Director General of Corrections Canada is one of our Church of the Nazarene Chaplains, Rev. Rick Burke. We have active prison chaplains in many centers across Canada.

Nazarene Compassionate Ministries Canada (NCMC)

As National Director is my responsibility to give executive direction to this important ministry of the Church of the Nazarene in Canada and around the world. There are unique opportunities open to us to have influence for the Gospel far out or proportion to our numeric strength. In July this year I plan to travel to Sri Lanka for the dedication of the *George and Phyllis Anstey Medical & Ministry Center* in Wattala (Colombo) Sri Lanka. Elaine Bumstead and Dr. Riley Coulter will join me there for this dedication. We are pleased that estate executrix, Linda Craig and her son Robert Westhafer, will represent the Anstey family at the ceremony.

Elaine Bumstead to serve as the Director of NCMC International; Audrey Dahl continues to serve as the Director of NCMC Domestic.

Conclusion

I continue to see it as good stewardship of our national and district resources for me to function in this dual capacity as National Director and as Superintendent of Canada Atlantic District. The staff we have in place in each office makes it possible for me to invest my time focusing on the large issues, leaving the critically important detail work to others who are skilled and fulfilled in those matters. I work hard and long at these things, but not unreasonably so. Progress for the Kingdom of God has always come at the price of hard work. I solicit your prayers as we move forward in proclaiming Christian Holiness to our generation.

C. Assembly Committees

1. Finance Committee

This report is to be reviewed by the local church board at the first board meeting following District Assembly.

Local Church Policy and Practice Recommendations regarding Finance:

1. Giving to others:
 - a) The district allocation will be set at 8.5% of adjusted income; 5.5% for the district, which will include allotments to auxiliaries (\$10,000 for NMI and SDMI and \$10,200 for NYI) and 3% for Education. Income is defined as all income that is eligible for a giving receipt, less World evangelism and 10% approved specials. (Approval for 10% project status must be made through the district office and will be approved by the Board of General Superintendents.) The following items are not eligible for a giving receipt and are not included in income: pass through funds, interest, capital gains, insurance claims, rental income, business income and refunds. The World evangelism fund percentage is 5.5% of adjusted income. The total local church "Giving to Others" is 14% (8.5% District and Education, 5.5% World Evangelism Fund). (Submission form on page 80).
 - b) The District Superintendent and District Advisory Board will schedule a consultation meeting with the pastor and church board of congregations that are not contributing the recommended percentage to others.
 - c) New Starts are encouraged to contribute through their sponsoring church.
 - d) We encourage churches to recognize this as a tithes and offerings model and participate on a monthly basis.
2. That each church contribute to Nazarene Theological Seminary and observe Seminary Sunday, the last Sunday of January each year by distributing Nazarene Theological Seminary publicity materials and contribute by receiving an offering on behalf of the campaign; or make provision in their church budget for a seminary gift.
3. The recommended honorarium for a speaker in the AM worship service is \$150.00 plus expenses. Churches are encouraged to reserve \$50.00 a month in an account set aside to cover a supply pastor should the regular pastor be away on a speaking engagement, continuing education, vacation, sick days, sabbatical or short term disability.
4. That each church board be urged to facilitate the development of an adequate church financial plan. This system should promote a much smoother disbursement of local church finances. The following are recommendations:
 - a) Churches are advised to project a balanced budget not a deficit budget.
 - b) It is wise not to project Tithe and Offering income increase to be more than 12% of that received in the previous year.

- c) We recommend that each congregation include an expenditure line in their budget and make regular deposits to a savings account (or some other similar account) in order to provide for property upkeep needs.
- d) Since a measurement of church health is per capita giving, attention should be given to this by the pastor and church board. Per capita income refers to the total giving divided by the average Sunday morning worship attendance. An amount that indicates a church is healthy is \$1,300.00. If the per capita giving is significantly below this figure, it *could* be indicating there is little instruction in giving and/or vision and challenge is unclear. If on the other hand, the per capita giving is significantly above this figure it *could* be indicating, outreach is lacking.
- e) Each stewardship committee should develop a procedure to ensure that funds are properly received, accounted for, and reported, as *Manual*, par. 129.21-129.23. The financial records and practices of our Churches must be reviewed yearly. We recommend that each congregation conduct either a professionally conducted financial review or one conducted by an independent audit committee at least once every five years (in years that end in 0 and 5, ie: 2015) and report to the district that the review has been completed.
- f) We further recommend that the church board and/or finance committee of each congregation review and implement the *Money Handling Guidelines*. (Page 58)

- 5. Local congregations with funds to invest should follow the Local Church Investment Guide. (Page 60)
- 6. Local churches selling property or using capital funds shall adhere to the *Sale of Church owned Property and the use of capital funds policy*. (Page 61)
- 7. When a local church desires to borrow money the *Approval to Borrow money* (Page 62) application must be completed.
- 8. When a local church desires to purchase property, the procedure outlined in the document *Approval to purchase* (available from the District Office) must be followed.
- 9. The following information regarding taxation of gifts to pastors, staff or volunteers should be noted:
 - a) All cash and near cash gifts (such as gift certificates) from the church are taxable. Funds that are forgiven or gifted are taxable benefits to the pastor. Please note that it is the recipient's responsibility to ensure the amount is claimed as income on their tax return unless the gift is over \$500. If the gift is over \$500, the church should issue a T4A.
 - b) Persons are allowed to receive 2 tax exempt gifts (non-cash or non-gift certificate) of up to \$500. in value per year. (such as a painting or office chair)
 - c) A love offering given by parishioners to pastor or staff is neither taxable nor receipt-able.

Local Church Policy & Practice Recommendations regarding Pastoral Arrangements:

10. Pastoral Arrangements

a) *The Written Understandings Document.*

In accordance with *Manual* paragraph 115.2, 115.4, 129.4, 129.8 each congregation will develop an employment agreement called *Written Understandings* prior to calling their pastor. Each year, the pastor and church board will conduct a planning session to renew the expectations and goals of the church and the *Written Understandings* shall be updated. It is the responsibility of the Secretary of the Board in cooperation with the Pastor and Church Board to ensure these responsibilities are carried out, and send an original signed copy of the Written understandings to the District Office. This agreement should be developed in a manner that includes all district and local church employment policies and practices. (Page 64)

b) *Salaries and Benefits:*

Salaries and Benefits are to be developed with care and compassion and in accordance with the financial ability of the congregation. Further guidance for salary development is found on the Salary Grid. (Page 78)

Involvement in the Church of the Nazarene Canada's RRSP plan is a mandatory requirement for all paid clergy employed 30 hours or more a week in a pastoral role. The minimum contribution for pastoral staff persons is 10% - 5% from the church and 5% from the pastor and that the contribution is to be made regularly each month. This agreement does not apply to temporary employees such as the Interim or Supply Pastor or retired Clergy unless specific arrangements are made.

We further advise that it is mandatory for the church to contribute 3% RSP for part time clergy working 30 hours or less. It is optional for the employee to contribute.

We further advise that other paid employees who are not employed as a pastor may be involved in the RRSP program at any level they wish to be. It is not mandatory on the part of either the employee or the church.

Since the RSP program is the only retirement program we have, Churches should give careful consideration to providing an adequate RSP for employees who are the only or major wage earner of their family.

c) *Pastoral Housing*

- i) We recommend that local congregations work to make it possible for all clergy pastors and staff to purchase their own home.
- ii) If money is loaned to the pastor at either a reduced interest rate or no interest rate, the interest benefit to the pastor may be a taxable benefit. Note: Canada Revenue Agency has an interest rate that is to be used as a guideline for calculation a taxable benefit.
- iii) If a loan is made to the pastor to assist in purchasing a home, a clear agreement between the pastor and the church should be drafted. The

agreement should include all specifics surrounding the loan, such as how and when the loan will be paid back. The repayment agreement should also include a statement explaining what action that will be in the event the pastor is unable to repay the loan according to the agreement. This agreement must be approved by the District Superintendent and District Advisory Board.

- iv) Because Pastors often move more frequently than lay persons, and a sale of the property usually needs to be done quickly, and loans are made to pastors who are often inexperienced in property purchases, the suggestion is that when a congregation loans the pastor funds for the purchase, a designated group from the board should act as consultants to the pastor in the house purchase. This group would provide advice regarding the area of the community in which the house is purchased, and the desirability of the house as it impacts resale.

d) *Local Church Staff Arrangements.*

We affirm that the Pastoral, associate and office staff ministry (paid and/or unpaid) is a necessity for the congregation which desires to grow and minister in an excellent manner. We urge all congregations to follow the Biblical directive of Ephesians 4:11, 12 of thoroughly preparing lay persons for ministry and affirm that the primary responsibility of pastoral and associate staff ministry is to enable and enhance lay ministry in the church.

It is essential that our Senior Pastors develop skill in locating, hiring and motivating staff. Staff positions must be renewed annually. We direct the District Superintendent not to renew employment of staff without assuring the yearly review has been completed and the *Written Understandings* are updated. (Manual 160.2).

Since *Manual* paragraph 160 indicates that DS and DAB approval of staff in a local church or any subsidiary and/or affiliated corporations of the local congregation is based upon the two criteria that paid associates will not:

1. "devitalize the spirit of free service by all its members, or
2. tax the church's financial resources including the payment of all financial apportionments."

Approval for hiring staff and for the renewal of staff hiring will not be granted to a congregation that has not contributed 14% of adjusted income to others.

Staff approval when 14% is not regularly being contributed:

Because we believe that at certain points in the development of ministries, paid staff become necessary for greater efficiency we will give grace for one year and approve staff who were previously hired under the following criteria:

1. that the operating budget is within the % distribution guidelines of the District Assembly Finance committee report,
 2. there is a clear plan to begin contributing 14% to others
11. That all churches provide financial assistance for their Pastor, paid pastoral staff, elected delegates and auxiliary presidents and chairpersons to attend the District Assembly and auxiliary conventions.

Local Church Policy and Practice, Other:

12. In order for a Church Board to be in harmony with the Canadian government's arms length policy, at least ½ of its membership must be at arms length. Persons not at "arm's length" includes close family members such as father, mother, sister, brother, spouse and in-laws.

When calculating arms length the total number includes all groups of arms length persons. For further clarification, please contact the district office. In the event that family members of the pastor and/or paid staff are elected members of the Church board or duly elected auxiliary leaders, we advise that in instances where issues related to family members are to be discussed, to avoid conflict of interest, that they be provided the opportunity to speak to the issue but then be dismissed from the meeting and that they would abstain from voting on business related to these matters.

13. Since the Pastor, Church Board Secretary and Church Board Treasurer have various legal responsibilities assigned by the *Manual*, we recommend each year the Pastor, Church Board Secretary and Church Board Treasurer review the responsibilities as listed in paragraphs 135-135.7. We especially draw attention to paragraph 135.3 regarding protecting the property and liability issues of the congregation.
14. We affirm that in cooperation with the spirit of Manual paragraphs 34.2, 38.1 and 38.2, churches and all subsidiary local and district ministries do not use lottery and raffle types of funding and do not solicit these types of monies.

District Finance and Property Policy and Practice:

15. That approved travel expense for all district boards and committee meetings be 20 cents per kilometre plus reimbursement of other approved applicable expenses (with pre-approval). Please note, this is not intended to be a guideline for local congregations to use in reimbursing their pastor and staff for travel. (Form on page 83).
16. That all District Boards, District Auxiliaries have their financial records and financial policies audited by a competent auditor or independent audit committee each year and report to the district assembly.
17. That since there has been no provision made in the District financial plan to subsidize delegates to the General Conventions; the various district auxiliary organizations should plan their finances to provide for the expense of each of their delegates. This will be accumulated in the District Investment Fund.
18. That since we are endeavoring to finance district operations from increasing returns from the District Investment Fund rather than by increasing local church percentages for Giving to others, the District Superintendent will arrange for a Financial Management and Estate Planning Seminar to be conducted in each local church.

19. District Investment Account Principles. (Deposit form on page 82). The following are the principles used by Canada West District financial management of the operational budget and the Investment Account.
- a) It is our intention to operate the district with a balanced budget.
 - b) Income comes primarily from local church Giving to Others percentage and from return on investment from the Investment Account.
 - c) All program and operational programs and expenditures must be projected and prepared for in advance and planned for in the year's operational budget.
 - d) The District Administrator and accountant have permission to transfer funds within account categories without prior approval. In the case of a new event that has not been budgeted for or planned for in advance and the expense will be over \$1000, funds from another account may be used for that event providing those funds will not be needed in the present church year, or jeopardize the next year's operations. In these circumstances, the DAB will act on a recommendation from the District Superintendent, the District Administrator and the DAB Finance Committee.
 - e) The Ambrose liaison fund reserve will receive the greater of the highest current interest rate the district is paying to bond holders (currently 2.75%) OR the annual estimated interest percentage achieved on the investment fund.
 - f) The rate paid to bond holders will be reviewed in April and October. 60 days notice will be given in the event of a decrease in the rate paid. Currently, Bond holders are paid 1.75% for those with up to \$50,000 in the fund, 2% for those with \$50,000 - \$100,000 in the fund and 2.75% for those with over \$100,000 in the fund.
 - g) The district will co-sign on property up to a maximum of 65% of district equity in the investment fund. Ministries on which the district has co-signed their loans will be asked to provide statements confirming their payment progress and anticipated date of payout twice annually.
 - h) As stated in our Investment fund policy, *"the excess of (investment) income over disbursements of the fund will be used to finance the various activities of the Canada West District Church of the Nazarene ministry programs"*. As a result, it is our practice that:
 - i) We will only use ROI from the Investment account, not capital or principle, for ministry programs, and
 - ii) Capital monies (principle in the Investment Account) will not be used for programs and projects except for those for which the principle has been raised and designated,
 - iii) Capital in the Investment Account is to be preserved primarily for gaining return on investment.
 - iv) Capital purchases of property and equipment (i.e. computers, automobiles) may be made from the Investment Account providing depreciation and losses will be returned from the operating account. Real estate purchases would be dealt with in a different manner.

THE NOMINATING PROCEDURE:

1. In order to facilitate recruitment of nominees, we will continue the policy of “as much as possible we will nominate twice as many nominees on the assembly ballot as need to be elected, except if there is one person to be elected, then we will nominate 3 persons.”
2. The nominating committee will place those people on the ballot by electing them (to the ballot). In order to do this, we will use the following procedure:
 - a) each member of the nominating committee will nominate all the persons they feel are capable of serving in that position.
 - b) From these lists, the first ballot will be formed and committee members will be asked to vote.
 - d) the ones receiving the most votes, and at least 5 votes, will be contacted to see if they will let their name stand for election at District Assembly.
3. In order to be placed on the Assembly ballot a candidate must:
 - a) Receive at least 50% of the votes cast from the nominating committee.
 - b) In the event of a tie, we will circulate a ballot with those (two) names on it and vote to break the tie.
4. Persons receiving the most votes will be considered elected to the nominating ballot. In case of decline of nomination, the Business Administrator will be authorized to go to the person with the next highest number of votes, providing that person has received at least 50% of the votes from the nominating committee. Otherwise the nominating committee will be asked to submit more nominees.
5. Regarding the eligibility of elders and deacons to serve on district boards: Only assigned or Retired Assigned elders and deacons are eligible.

RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE ASSEMBLY:

1. In accordance with *Manual** paragraph 233, the District Advisory Board will serve as the District Church Properties Board.
2. Elections be by plurality vote.

3. When there are multiple terms of office, the persons with the highest number of votes will serve for the longer terms of reference; and that in the event of a tie, we use alphabetical order to determine order of election.
4. Board of Ministry. The present policy, established in 1999, is as follows: In accordance with *Manual* 203.17, the District boards of Ministerial Credentials and Ministerial Studies will serve as the District Board of Ministry and the district will elect the total number necessary to serve on both boards and allow them to organize themselves in a manner most suitable to fulfill these responsibilities.
 - a) And that the total number of the board be 15 plus the District Superintendent.
 - b) And that the terms of election be staggered so that the required number of members will be elected each year to serve a term of four years (*Manual* 203.15).
